AAFP Releases Updated Feline Senior Care Guidelines

Updated 2021 AAFP Feline Senior Care Guidelines was published by the American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) in the *Journal of Feline Medicine and Surgery* July issue. The guidelines establish a senior cat as one over 10 years of age and are intended to help the veterinary team in assessing and treating feline medical conditions related to aging. Examinations are recommended at a minimum of every 6 months for senior felines to catch disease early and track the progression of known conditions. Senior cats over 15 years should be examined at least every 4 months. Patients with medical conditions should be seen more frequently depending on the stage of their illness.

The guidelines also address issues in aging cats that include weight loss, pain management, quality of life assessments and end of life decisions. When making plans for end of life, the guidelines urge veterinarians to consider four budgets – financial, time, emotional and physical – as all of these will affect owners and their relationships with their pets.

An End of Life Toolkit has also been created by the AAFP. This toolkit includes resources for veterinarians to discuss quality of life and help owner's come to the decision as well as anesthesia and sedative guidelines and tips for supporting clients through the process. Veterinarians on 'High Alert' as Reports of Dog Flu Cases Spread BY: SAMANTHA BARTLETT, DVM

The past few months have seen a rise in canine influenza cases in pockets throughout the United States. As in past outbreaks, affected dogs mostly show signs of coughing, and respiratory issues. Few cases, mostly in older or debilitated dogs, have lead to hospitalization or death.

The virus is highly contagious and almost every dog that has exposure will become infected. Most notably, the virus is easily spread on fomites, making it particularly challenging to handle in a veterinary setting.

There is a vaccine for two strains of canine influenza H3N2 and H3N8. Infected dogs should be isolated from other dogs until after their symptoms have subsided. If a known outbreak is in your area, avoid exposing your dog to other dogs outside of the household. This includes boarding and grooming facilities and dog parks. Summer travel holidays are a big concern as more dogs are boarded during this time leading to a potential for greater exposure and spread.

New Study Focuses on Factors That Make Veterinarians Feel Good at Work

A study by researchers at the University of Adelaide, published by Vet Record, aims to discover factors that make veterinarians feel good at work. The study was created in response to national shortages of veterinarians and in light of risks and challenges posed by the veterinary profession. Researchers hope the study can help to focus on positive aspects of the career field and help with retention and attraction of new veterinarians to the field.

The study involved a questionnaire in which respondents were asked to provide up to 10 responses to finish the statement "I derive pleasure from my work as veterinarian when..." There were 273 respondents, all Australian veterinarians, who provided over 2500 responses. The responses were grouped and categorized. Positive relationships between clients and vets and vets and colleagues were more frequent responses than positive relationship with animals. Other findings showed that veterinarians feel good when shown trust and respect and when they have opportunities to use special skills. Other factors include positive work culture, opportunities to collaborate with other veterinarians and successful patient outcomes.

This information can be used to improve work environments by introducing recognition systems, increasing opportunities to interact with colleagues, implementing peer mentoring programs. Developing programs for personal development and helping employees further their interests and skillsets can enhance positivity in the workplace.

Initiative Provides a Safe Environment for Veterinary Professionals to Connect

The Riptide Project was created by Dr. Vicki Lim, a veterinarian working in New Zealand and a founder member of the World Small Animal Veterinary Association (WSAVA) Professional Wellness Group (PWG). She started the project after developing an interest in mental health and wellbeing issues during vet school. The Riptide Project is meant to provide an encouraging and safe environment that allows veterinary professionals to connect and share experiences.

Dr. Lim established the Riptide Project in 2017. She wanted to bridge the gap between employers voicing their initiatives to protect mental health and employees' (vets and nurses) perspectives of those initiatives upon their day-to-day lives. A subproject, called Riptide Cuppa, connects individuals with one of 200 mentors who can provide guidance and support.

Dr. Lim constantly runs into people all over the world who share stories of how the project has helped them. Dr. Lim finds the individual success stories of the project gratifying and seeks to make the profession as positive for others as it is for her.

Parasites Carrying Pathogens Continue to Expand Ranges in 2021 BY: SAMANTHA BARTLETT. DVM

The Companion Animal Parasite Council (CAPC) released the 2021 Pet Parasite Forecast in May. The ranges of ticks and mosquitoes have continued to expand across the United States leading to an increased risk of exposure to disease pathogens including heartworm, Lyme, *Ehrlichia* and *Anaplasma spp*. CAPC makes the forecast based on work done by parasitologists and statisticians who analyze positive tests for disease, influence of weather patterns, vegetation indices and the density of human populations.

Heartworm prevalence is forecast to be higher along the Mississippi River, throughout southern Midwest and along the Atlantic Coast. CAPC cautions veterinarians in states with historically low incidence of heartworm to be aware of the increasing risk and to begin having conversations with their clients about the disease. This is particularly true for the interior Midwest and lower Great Lakes regions.

Lyme disease has continued to progress southward and westward. Increases are expected in eastern Kentucky, northeastern Tennessee, western Michigan and Ohio. CAPC recommends that veterinarians in these regions as well as in regions that have historically high prevalence to encourage clients to be vigilant about tick control and prevention.

The prevalence of *Anaplasma* species is expected to remain the same throughout most of the United States. CAPC does warn areas of Virginia, West Virginia, Texas and California to be vigilant to increases in prevalence in these areas. *Ehrlichia* has a variable range due to the many responsible species and prevalence is expected to remain high. Areas expected to see an increase include New Mexico, Arizona, California, Wyoming, Illinois, Wisconsin and Minnesota.
