

AVMA Creates New Resources for Monkeypox Information

Monkeypox shares the Orthopoxvirus family with smallpox and cowpox. With the eradication of the smallpox virus, monkeypox is now the most important orthopoxvirus in relation to public health.

The virus was first discovered in colonies of research monkeys and has since been discovered in several rodent species in Africa. African rodents are suspected to be the main reservoir host, but this is not yet confirmed.

In late July 2022, the World Health Organization declared a global monkeypox emergency. Disease transmission so far involves close contact with another infected person. The virus can be transmitted through respiratory droplets, wounds in the skin, contact with fomites and through ingestion of infected meat.

Monkeypox is a disease of mammals. To date one case of a dog infected with monkeypox outside of Africa has been reported. It is thought the dog received the infection from an infected human. It is unknown if cats are susceptible but it is thought probable based on the behavior of other Orthopoxviruses. People with monkeypox are advised to have someone else care for their pets or limit their contact with their pets while suffering from the virus.

The AVMA has developed a webpage to provide information for pet owners and veterinarians regarding monkeypox. The page includes information on diagnosing and preventing the spread of monkeypox as well as how to report suspected cases. Congressional Subcommittee Hearing Requests Review of Seresto Collars by EPA

The Seresto collar is a flea and tick collar containing two active ingredients: imidacloprid and flumethrin. The collar is sold by Elanco Animal Health. Since it is a topical product with no systemic mode of action, the collar is regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Seresto was approved by the EPA on the basis of more than 80 studies focusing on safety, toxicity and efficacy.

The collars came into the spotlight in May 2021 after a report from USA Today and the Midwest Center for Investigative Reporting found that the EPA had received more than 75,000 incident reports since the Seresto collar was first introduced on the market in 2012. The collars are alleged to be responsible for 2500 pet deaths and more than 98,000 incidents of harm to humans. During that time frame, Elanco claims to have sold more than 33 million collars. On July 15, 2022, the Subcommittee on Economic and Consumer Policy, which belongs to the U.S. House of Representative's Committee on Oversight and Reform, held a hearing on Seresto collars.

The subcommittee released a report that requested a voluntary recall of the collars. The report also requested that the EPA cancel Seresto's registration and improve animal safety studies and the collection of pet incident data. The EPA is currently conducting a review of the collar and incident frequency and severity.

In a written statement to the congressional subcommittee, Jeffrey Simmons, President and CEO of Elanco Animal Health, defended the Seresto flea and tick collar as safe and effective. He noted that adverse incident reports do not necessary mean that the incident was caused by the product. According to Mr. Simmons, Elanco's pharmacovigilance team



is not aware of any deaths caused by the active ingredients of the collar.

Support has also come from the AVMA and the Pet Poison Hotline. Gail Golab, AVMA chief veterinary officer, added that while the risk of adverse events is present, the risk of health conditions and disease caused by parasites is much greater. In May 2021, veterinary toxicologists from the Pet Poison Hotline deemed that the benefits of the Seresto collar outweighed the "extremely rare risk of a serious adverse event." The Pet Poison Hotline has handled about 400 cases involving the collar – most of which involved ingestion of the collar by dogs – and the adverse events were mild.

The AVMA has requested that the EPA not cancel Seresto's registration until a full evaluation of the data has been conducted. They are hopeful that once all of the data has been reviewed, a clearer picture of the collar's safety will come to light and the collar will be able to stay on the market as a safe, accessible option for flea and tick prevention.

Research Shows Small-Breed Male Dogs in Cities Have Highest Risk of Contracting Leptospirosis.

Leptospirosis has historically been a higher risk disease in large breed, male herding dogs. The disease is spread by exposure to Leptospira spp. through the urine of reservoir hosts (rodents), primarily in standing water. However, new research shows a changing trend in at-risk populations of dogs.

A study examined trends of dogs diagnosed with leptospirosis in the United States and Canada over the past 40 years. Diagnosed cases peaked in 1971 and then fell in the succeeding years. However in the 1990s and 2000s cases began to climb dramatically. During this



time, cases increased in male dogs between 2 and 9.9 years of age that were under 15 pounds.

The researchers are unsure what drove the change in pattern, but speculate urbanization, new Leptospira spp. strains in urban wildlife and vaccination practices may all play a role. The researchers behind the new study did not have information on exposure and vaccination history. This may speak to an inaccurate perception of risk and prevalence of disease leading to inappropriate vaccination practices. Practitioners need to be educated on the regional and seasonal risks of leptospirosis infections in the canine populations they treat.

Study Explores How Dogs Think of Their Toys.


Researchers from the Family Dog Project conducted a study to decipher how dogs mentally see their toys. The study, published in Animal Cognition, concluded that familiar objects are comprised of a multi-modal image in a dog's mind. Dogs combine different sensors to form the image including the way the object looks and smells.

The researchers used a group of gifted word learner dogs (dogs that have learned the names of objects) along with 10 typical family dogs in the study. The dogs were trained to fetch a toy associated with a reward. They received treats for choosing the named toy over several distractor toys. The researchers noted how the dogs searched for the specified toy that was always hidden among four other toys. The searches were conducted both with the lights on and in the dark. Although all dogs were successful in both light and dark conditions, they searched longer in the dark.

The researchers noted the dogs relied both on visual and smell to identify the named toy, however, they preferred to rely on their sight over their sense of smell. The dogs did rely on their sense of smell more in the dark, but still only slightly more. Researchers concluded from this study that when presented with a specific object, dogs made note of both visual and olfactory features of the object in order to identify it mentally.

FDA Grants Conditional Approval for the Use of Pimobendan to Delay Congestive Heart Failure in Dogs

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) granted conditional approval in June to expand the use of Pimobendan to delay the onset of congestive heart failure in dogs with preclinical myxomatous mitral valve disease. Since 2007, Pimobendan has been approved to manage clinical signs of congestive heart failure caused by dilated cardiomyopathy or atrioventricular valvular insufficiency.

Conditional approval means that the FDA believes the drug has a reasonable expectation of effectiveness and safety. The conditional status will allow Boehringer Ingelheim Animal Health USA to market a drug while the FDA collects efficacy data for full approval. The approval is valid for one year but can be renewed up to four times. Boehringer has five years to obtain full approval for the new indications. Boehringer will market pimobendane under two names: Vetmedin for the original indications with full approval and Vetmedin-CA1 for the conditionally approved indications. Both labels will have the same active ingredient at the same dosages.

The effectiveness of Vetmedin-CA1 was determined in a long-term study in client owned dogs with cardiomegaly. Dogs were either given Vetmedin or a placebo with no active ingredient. The median time from starting treatment to an endpoint of left-sided congestive heart failure, death or euthanasia due to cardiac disease. The duration was 15.6 months longer in the Vetmedin-CA1 group than the control group. The guidelines for implementation of Vetmedin-CA1 are delineated in a 2019 ACVIM Consensus Statement for Stage B2 MMVD (https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih. gov/30974015/).
